Let's Cook Something!!!

Spinach Pasta Toss

Ingredients

- 1- 15 ounce can Italian-style diced tomatoes, undrained
- 2 cups multi-grain penne pasta, uncooked
- 1 cup water
- 3 cups baby spinach leaves
- 1 cup 2% Milk, Shredded Italian Three Cheese Blend (optional)

Directions

Bring tomatoes, pasta and water to a boil in a large saucepan; stir. Cover; simmer on medium-low heat for 10 minutes or just until pasta is tender. Add ½ of spinach; simmer, covered 2 minutes or until wilted. Stir. Repeat until remaining spinach is added.

Serve topped with cheese.

For a spicier dish, add ¼ teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes with the tomatoes.




