- Tier 2 focuses on global communities, culture, & service through a trip either abroad or in-country Native American Reservation.

# 4-H Day At The Capitol

 Held every other year, on odd number years, Day At The Capitol allows 4-H members to learn about legislation that affects them & visit with elected state officials about 4-H.

- Held every other year, on even number years, members grades 9-12 visit the State Capitol to write & submit laws.
- The laws then follow the legislation process through the House & Senate.
