## National 4-H Week

- National 4-H Week is a week celebrating 4-H.
- Use this week as an opportunity to meet with County Commissioners & present them with a resolution to get National 4-H Week recognized in your county

## One Day 4-H

- While community service should be a continuous effort, One Day 4-H is a day, usually at the end of National 4-H Week, that is designated for counties across the state to participate in a service project representing 4-H.

## G.L.O.B.E.

### Global Leadership Opportunities Beyond Education

- G.L.O.B.E. is a two tiered program designed to encourage members to understand other cultures as well as engage meaningful community service projects.
- **Tier 1** consists of a team building & leadership camp that creates cultural competency through emerging students in a simulated third-world environment.
- **Tier 2** focuses on global communities, culture, & service through a trip either abroad or in-country Native American Reservation.

**\*\*** Citizenship & Community Service projects can be self-led or conducted in a group setting **\*\***

## 4-H Day At The Capitol

- Held every other year, on odd number years, Day At The Capitol allows 4-H members to learn about legislation that affects them & visit with elected state officials about 4-H.

## 4-H

### Congress

- Held every other year, on even number years, members grades 9-12 visit the State Capitol to write & submit laws.
- The laws then follow the legislation process through the House & Senate.
